

Council Updates (with clarification on March 17th)

Dear Readers,

It has been brought to our attention that the statement about our debt could be misinterpreted; so please let us clarify, (and all numbers are rounded to the nearest thousand). The \$109K debt mentioned below was specific to a \$130K loan taken out to cover the expenses of the addition and new roof to the "church proper". By the end of January, 2014, we still owed \$109K and in February the

council was able to pay off \$40K of the loan, as described below. This statement does NOT include the outstanding debt on the 20 year mortgage taken out in 2006 for the purchase of Holy Cross Christian Center (HCCC) building. To be clear, at the end of January there is still \$252K owed on this mortgage, and we continue to make our regular payments on this debt.
