## May 2017 Working together to connect people to Jesus

#### Teaching the Children Diligently

Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes." - Deuteronomy 6:4-7

The mission of the church is to "go and make disciples of all nations." On April 30, 2017 we are blessed to witness the confirmation of Lindsey Chalmers, Morgan Chalmers, Mason Kelkenberg, Emma Scarantine and Christine Wood. Confirmation celebrates the teaching part of the mission that Jesus gave to us, the Church: to go "baptizing... [in the name of the Triune God] and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20) Confirmation expresses publicly - "in the presence of God and this congregation" - the beliefs "confessed" by one who has been baptized and now taught the basics of the Christian faith. But the Church is not done "making disciples" of Lindsey, Morgan, Mason, Emma and Christine on Confirmation Sunday. Confirmation is not graduation! As long as you breathe, the Holy Spirit is not finished making a disciple out of you yet, either. You only "graduate" when you see Christ face to face. In the meantime, the Holy Spirit continues to shape you. He does this by His means of grace - His Holy Word and the Sacraments - where you receive the forgiveness that remakes you to reflect the image of your Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

In Hebrew, the phrase "teach them diligently" implies repetition, like sharpening a knife blade over and over again on a whetstone. "Teaching our children diligently" is not just the work of the pastor, our Sunday School teachers, or even the parents of the children in our congregation. It is the task of everyone in the congregation - first and especially the family of the children: parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, sisters, brothers, etc. Any Christian can, and should, repeat God's Word to children. In doing so, we are building up the body of Christ, right here at Holy Cross.

God instructs parents to "teach them diligently" by repeating His Word to them. When? How about:

"when you sit in your house" ... like parents having a designated Bible story time at home

"when you walk by the way" ... like when driving to or from church, school or a sports practice

"when you lie down" ... like having a Bible story time and prayer before bedtime

"when you rise" ... when you get up, have breakfast and perhaps read Portals of Prayer together.

Here's a challenge for you: When you encounter children at Holy Cross, what is ONE Bible verse that you can share with them? The Apostle Thomas is known for saying, "My Lord and my God" when he encountered the risen Jesus Christ. (John 20:28) What verse would you like to be remembered for saying? How about something simple like, "Peace be with you," as Jesus says in John 20:19? How about something encouraging like, "For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God," as Paul says in Romans 8:14? Perhaps your own confirmation verse?



#### **Summer Hours:**

In June, July, and August Holy Cross will have two Sunday services at 8:00am and 10:00am. This will begin on Sunday June 4th. We will resume our "regular hours" on Sunday, September 3rd and Rally Day will be on Sunday, September 10th. The last day of Sunday School is Sunday May 21st.

## **Holy Cross 2016 Financial Report:**

Once again Holy Cross has been blessed by God with good stewardship on both sides of the accounting ledger. We are pleased to report that the offerings "subject to tithing" for 2016 totaled \$292,167 compared to the \$268,064 collected in 2015 which represents an increase of \$24,103 or 8.99%. Compared to the 2016 anticipated Budget of \$268,010, the amount received was greater than the amount budgeted by \$24,157 or 9.01%. Also, the "Total Income" for 2016 totaled \$296,149 compared to \$270,178 for 2015 which represents an increase of \$25,971 or 9.61%.

Holy Cross's expenses for 2016 totaled \$252,051 compared to \$242,212 expended in 2015, which represents an increase in spending of \$9,838 or 4.06%; however, compared to the budgeted amount of \$249,925 our expenses were less than the amount budgeted by \$2,126 or 0.85%. Combined, this resulted in an operating surplus of \$44,099 for 2016.

With this blessing and some carry over blessings from 2015, on January 28, 2016, the Church Council voted to utilize \$30,000 of excess Operating Fund cash to make a special principal reduction payment on the LCEF mortgage. And again on August 25, 2016 the Church Council voted to utilize \$40,000 of excess Operating Fund cash to make a second special principal reduction payment on the LCEF mortgage. This, in addition to \$2,100 in designated member debt reduction offerings, resulted in a mortgage balance at the end of 2016 of \$117,309, compared to \$212,998 at the end of 2015, and leaving Holy Cross with a yearend Operating Fund cash balance of \$61,890.

And, in addition to the Operating Fund, Holy Cross maintains several "Restricted Funds", the "Dream Fund", and a "Building Budget". On December 31st, 2016, Holy Cross had \$13,999 in miscellaneous restricted funds, \$28,729 in the Dream Fund and \$71,908 in the Building Fund.

The long term goal of the Council is an early satisfaction of the mortgage on the Holy Cross Christian Center, (before April 2026), which when paid off, would free up approximately \$2,400 each month, that could then be used to further grow His Kingdom. Another goal we have is to prepare for anticipated building maintenance expenses, such as the heating units in Holy Cross and other large property maintenance costs.

But lest we forget, giving all thanks and glory to God, by His grace our congregation was blessed to share in the mission and ministry of the whole Christian Church, and with our prayers we were able to participate and support the efforts of our Circuit, our District and The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod; our Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and Operation Christmas Child missions; our inkind donations to Hearts for the Homeless, the Clarence Food Pantry, and others, and our collective financial support to mission and mercy work outside Holy Cross in the amount of \$39,811 in 2016 (compared to \$27,852 in 2015).

#### **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY NEWS**

Habitat provides housing for low income people who do not qualify for a traditional mortgage. The applicant must meet certain qualifications and work 500 volunteer hours in order to obtain an interest free mortgage.

Habitat also has 2 stores called ReStores. The stores are not for profit. They sell new and gently used appliances, building supplies and materials, furniture and home accessories. They do not sell clothing. Many of the items are donated by stores and construction companies as well as individuals and are re-sold at a fraction of the cost of retail. The proceeds are then used to help build more homes. If you wish to donate items they can arrange a pickup.
