Taste that the Lord is Good

"Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation - if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good." 1 Peter 2:1-3

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As Thanksgiving approaches, we think about good food and hospitality. Chances are, we may invite people over to our homes, or we may be invited to someone else's home for dinner. Have you been invited over for dinner by someone, perhaps who is from a different culture or just has a different cooking style than you're used to? Did the food tasted "funny"? We might be tempted to tell a "white lie" and say we like the food even if we don't, in an effort to be polite. Worse, we might afterwards say something malicious to people who are more "like us" or more used to the same things we're used to. But food offered in Christian fellowship is given to us by God through another part of the body of Christ.

Psalm 34 reminds us, "Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking deceit." Yet the very same psalm offers a Gospel message: "Taste and see that the Lord is good!" It points forward to our Savior, Jesus, who died and rose to forgive our hypocrisy and deceitfulness. He gives us His own body and blood so that we may taste and see that He is good. In the Sacrament of the Altar His goodness becomes part of us. It empowers us to forgive and build the body of Christ.

Through Word and Sacrament the Holy Spirit offers the pure spiritual milk that nourishes us into salvation. When Jesus comes again in glory we will be grown up fully into salvation, because we have tasted that the Lord is good!

Dear Jesus, You earned our salvation. Grant that we may taste the pure spiritual milk of Your goodness that nourishes us into salvation. Amen.

Update From Council

Once again Holy Cross continues to be blessed with generous giving; so much so, that as of the end of August, our giving has been up by 8% and our expenses are down by 3%, (compared to our 2016 budget). And thanks to some designated offerings, when the Council considered this, and our other financial metrics, Holy Cross was able to make a payment to reduce the mortgage on the Christian Center by approximately \$42K, leaving our current balance at approximately \$125K. A big thank you, to everyone, from everyone, for your generous giving. In other news, we hope evervone has met Samantha Brown by now. Thanks to considerable help from Camp Pioneer, we will have Samantha working with us until May, while she completes her internship as she pursues a degree as a Director of Christian Education from Concordia, Chicago, Speaking of Camp Pioneer, we hope everyone has seen their urgent appeal for help. As a Church, we have already made our 2016 commitment to Camp Pioneer, but we are reviewing their need as we prepare our 2017 budget. In addition, a group of us went to the Camp Pioneer informational meeting on Wednesday, October 19th at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in North Tonawanda. Lastly, we continue to strive to provide opportunities for all to grow in their Christian walk. On October 14th and 15th we will be hosted a LCMS seminar, "Connect to Discipleship", as well as the many other opportunities for adult and youth Christian Education we host weekly. (And let's not forget the "Netflix" of Christian material, "Right Now Media", that is available to all Holy Cross members for in-home studies. Please see Peter Olsen for log-in information.) We encourage all our members to take advantage of these opportunities so that we may all go out and better reflect the love of God to our neighbors and friends. Pioneer Camp Appeal

Eastern District President Chris Wicher and camp director Rev. Alex Knowles are holding meet ins about the current situation at Pioneer Camp. Past generous support from Holy Cross and others, has really made a difference in the lives of many people. As you know, 2016 was a great year at Pioneer Camp and even in the fall months, hundreds of youth, teens and adults came to our camp to grow in their love and faith toward God.

As you may know, the Pioneer Camp Board of Directors issued an appeal to raise an additional \$100,000 between October and December 31, 2016. As of October 18th \$26,000 has been raised. Decreased contributions over the last two years is the major factor as to why Pioneer is in this crisis situation, that, combined with the rising cost of maintaining facilities and expanding programs has greatly stressed the finances of the camp.

The camp has solutions in place for 2017, but needs to get there. 2017 is already looking strong with an increase in retreats, events and stronger summer programs. The food is great and the facilities are improving every year. The staff has done a great job in developing a strong business model that is in keeping with our vision: to show the face of Jesus to all ~ by words and actions ~ amidst the splendor of God's creation; and mission: to offer a safe, joy-filled outdoor experience where lives are renewed and strengthened in Christ.

God has touched the hearts and minds of so many of us at camp, and we want to be able to see that continue for our children and our grandchildren. In this dark and difficult world, Camp Pioneer is still a place where our kids, whatever age they are, can still be kids, and where families can grow together.
